	Type of Count:	Description:	Example Pierre School District	Website for this Data
1)	State Aid Fall Enrollment	As per SDCL 13-13-10.1 (general aid funding purposes) State aid fall enrollment is a count of students enrolled in grades KG-12 on the last Friday of September. This count includes all students enrolled and served within the district (including open enrolled students) and students assigned out of district. This count would not include students for whom the district receives tuition or have exceeded the age of 21. This count is reported in terms of an ADM -- which allows for students enrolled less than full time to be included in this count (example: home school student enrolls in the district for 2 classes may be .40 or 40% enrolled in the public school district and .60 or 60% enrolled in home school). 2)	Student Count for General State Aid Funding Purposes	AS per SDCL 13-13-10.1 (general aid funding purposes) State aid fall enrollment is a count of students enrolled in grades KG-12 on the last Friday of September.....When computing state aid to education for a school district under the foundation program pursuant to § 13-13-73, the secretary of the <u>Department of Education shall use either the school district's fall enrollment or the average of the school district's fall enrollment from the previous two years, whichever is higher.</u>	FY2012 Student Count Used for Funding Purposes = 2,565.28 (Pierre used the 2 year average student count)	http://www.doe.sd.gov/ofm/statefunding.aspx
3)	Fall (Census) Enrollment	Unduplicate head count of students enrolled and served in the district on the last Friday of September. This count would not include any students assigned out of district or any student that is not at least 50% of day enrolled. This count is used for statistical reporting, it is NOT used for state funding purposes. Data is always reported as whole numbers and reports are provided by grade level, ethnicity, and gender. 4)	Enrollment Average Daily Membership (ADM)	This is a count of the average daily membership of all students for the full school year reported on the school district profile in the annual Statistical Digest. This count of students represents an accumulation of all student enrollments served in the district throughout the school year. Data is reported to the nearest thousandth decimal point. 5)	Enrollment Average Daily Attendance (ADA)	This is a count of the average daily attendance of all students for the full school year and reported on the school district profile in the annual Statistical Digest. This count of students represents an accumulation of all days of attendance for all students served in the district throughout the school year. Data is reported to the nearest thousandth decimal point.	ADA for 2011-2012 school year, K-12 = 2,374.969	http://www.doe.sd.gov/ofm/statdigest.aspx
6)	Average Daily Membership for State & County Apportionment	This is a count of RESIDENT school age students and calculated as per SDCL 13-13-1 & 13-13-1.1. This ADM includes home school students, student open enrolled to other public schools, private school students and out of district placements. The count does NOT include students open enrolled into your district. This ADM would be used to allocate both state and county apportionment in the 2012-2013 school year.	ADM for 2011-2012 school year, K-12 = 2,598.137	

7)	Student Count used for SE Funding Purposes (level 1)	As per SDCL 13-37-35.1, this count is the sum of the previous school year of the public school district state aid fall enrollment plus the fall enrollment of students enrolled in non-public schools (excluding BIE schools) located within the boundaries of the public school district and the fall enrollment of students under the age of eighteen who are enrolled in alternative instruction pursuant to SDCL 13-27-2. The statute further clarifies the inclusion of non-public student counts: 1) for nonpublic schools located within the boundaries of a public school district with a fall enrollment of six hundred or more on the last Friday of September of the previous school year, the number of kindergarten through twelfth grade pupils enrolled on the last Friday of September of the previous regular school year in all nonpublic schools located within the boundaries of the public school district and 2) for nonpublic schools located within the boundaries of a public school district with a fall enrollment of less than six hundred on the last Friday of September of the previous school year, the number of resident kindergarten through twelfth grade pupils enrolled on the last Friday of September of the previous school year in all nonpublic schools located within the State of South Dakota	ADM for 2011-2012 SE funding = 2,791.330	http://www.doe.sd.gov/ofm/statefunding.aspx
8)	December FEDERAL Child Count	This is a count of students with an active IEP on December 1st. Students are reported by primary disability, services provided and educational setting.	December 2011 Federal Child Count Total = 305	http://www.doe.sd.gov/ofm/statdigest.aspx
9)	December STATE Child Count	This count differs from the FEDERAL child count in that students identified for federal purposes as multiply disabled may not meet the state definition. SDLC 13-37-36.2 states that "for the purpose of calculating state aid pursuant to this chapter, a level five disability shall meet criteria for at least two disability categories in levels two and three, excluding the disability of deaf-blindness." State child count includes those students counted for levels 2-6 for special education funding. December 2011 state child count would be used for 2012-2013 special education aid funding calculations.
